As the 2011 Golf season comes to a close, I would like to thank my staff for the excellent job they did. Grass does not know what day of the week it is, or care what plans you made with your friends. When the weather cooperates, producing a well manicured golf course is not a very difficult thing to do. In my opinion, tough growing conditions are what separate the true professionals from the amateurs in this business. Whether it was finishing the demolition of the pool house, coming in to mow fairways on a Saturday because they were too wet on Friday, working 14 hours on a Sunday (syringing the turf) because it was 88 degrees with 25 mph winds and 22% humidity, or working every holiday that falls during the spring and summer. My staff really stepped up when called upon as usual. Many people don't realize that producing a golf course that plays well is a 7 day a week operation. Once the season begins, my staff works 6 or 7 days a week the entire summer, and believe it or not, I hear very few complaints. We only have one week a year that is a mandatory 7 day work week, and that is during our Invitational. When I put a list on the board

in the morning for volunteers to work 7 days a week (for other important events), the list is usually filled with names by lunch time. This dedication is what produces results. A manager with the best plans in the world, without a workforce that is willing to take direction and strive for perfection; will never get results. Thank you guys for another great season!

Over the next week or two, you will see us completing fall leaf clean-up. Sending the golf course into winter with all of the leaves cleaned up pays dividends in the spring. Mulching dry leaves in the fall is much easier than raking wet leaves the following spring. This work also reduces the amount of work necessary to make the golf course playable in the spring. Grass that has a bed of leaves sitting on top of it is also much more susceptible to snow mold than grass that is open and can transpire or "breathe".

Our fall tree work has begun and will continue through the winter. We will be removing dead trees, and trimming low hanging branches. Doing this work in house is a huge cost savings, and gives the crew valuable work on mornings with frost or days when we are caught up on the mowing and trimming. Last year we removed 27 dead or dying trees in house and trimmed every tree on the golf course. Many of the trees that need to be removed are too large or too dangerous for us to remove in house; we use professionals for these dangerous trees. Operating a chain saw can be a very dangerous job. We are always sure to wear the proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) when operating all machinery. For chainsaws, this means safety glasses, hearing protection, and kevlar chaps that can't be cut through.

Our goal is to provide consistent playing conditions on a daily basis with an emphasis on attention to detail. I believe that attention to detail is what separates the good golf courses from the great ones like Saginaw Country Club.

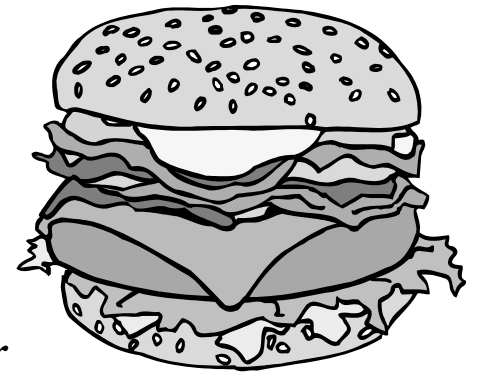
